






## Forecast Details

<b>TONIGHT</b>	Cloudy...Warmer. Lows in the upper 50s. Southeast winds 5 to 10 mph.
<b>SUNDAY</b>	Cloudy. A slight chance of rain and isolated thunderstorms in the morning...Then a chance of rain and isolated thunderstorms in the afternoon. Highs in the mid 70s. South winds 5 to 10 mph. Chance of rain 20 percent in the morning increasing to 40 percent in the afternoon.
<b>SUNDAY NIGHT</b>	Rain and isolated thunderstorms in the evening... Then showers and scattered thunderstorms after midnight. Cooler. Lows in the upper 40s. South winds around 5 mph in the evening becoming northwest after midnight. Chance of rain 90 percent in the evening Decreasing to 80 percent after midnight.
<b>MONDAY</b>	Thunderstorms and showers in the morning...Then showers and scattered thunderstorms in the afternoon. Much cooler. Highs in the upper 40s. Temperature steady or slowly falling in the afternoon. North winds around 15 mph. Chance of rain 80 percent.
<b>MONDAY NIGHT</b>	Cloudy with showers likely. Lows in the lower 40s. Northeast winds 10 to 15 mph. Chance of rain 50 percent.
