<b>REST OF TONIGHT</b>	Rain and mountain snow likely. Mountain snow accumulation of 1 to 3 inches above 4500 feet. Lows in the lower to mid 30s. Chance of precipitation 70 percent.
<b>FRIDAY</b>	Cloudy with rain and mountain snow in the morning... Then partly sunny with a chance of rain and mountain snow in the afternoon. Mountain snow accumulation of 1 to 3 inches. Snow level 4000 feet in the morning...Lowering to 3000 feet in the afternoon. Highs in the upper 30s to lower 40s. Chance of precipitation 80 percent.
<b>FRIDAY NIGHT</b>	Mostly cloudy. A chance of snow in the evening. Areas of fog overnight. Lows in the 20s. Chance of precipitation 20 percent.
<b>SATURDAY</b>	Cloudy. Areas of fog in the morning. A slight chance of snow in the morning...Then a slight chance of rain or snow in the afternoon. Snow level 2500 feet in the afternoon. Highs in the mid to upper 30s. Chance of precipitation 20 percent.
<b>SATURDAY NIGHT</b>	Mostly cloudy with a 20 percent chance of snow. Areas of fog overnight. Lows in the upper 20s to lower 30s.
